# **Gross Annual Billings**

Clarification has been provided for Radiologists and Pathologists on **page 6** about what needs to be provided when they do not generate any billings under their provider numbers.

#### **Volunteer Practice**

Clarification has been provided that members volunteering at amateur sporting events must be familiar with and acting in accordance with the Australian Institute of Sports (AIS) guidelines on concussion.

# **Optional Cover**

Information has been included on optional cover for the treatment of public patients in the public system and the process to apply for this cover.

# Changes to Risk Categorisation

## Final Year Student/Intern

We have included that any International Medical Graduates (IMG) who are required to undertake an intern placement at a public hospital upon commencement of practice in Australia should contact our Member Services team to confirm the appropriate category.

# Post Graduate (PGY) and Doctors in Specialist Training (DiST) categories

- A table has been introduced on Pages 17 to 20 clarifying the eligibility criteria under the training categories and circumstances where these categories are not appropriate.
- Clarification has been provided that only the education and training component of Fellowship Support Program (FSP) is eligible for the DIST category.

## **Minor Cosmetics**

The following procedure has been added to the Minor Cosmetics category

 Platelet Rich Fibrin (PRF) therapy for skin rejuvenation (excluding application to genitalia)

## **Dermatology**

The following has been included under Dermatology category:

If you are a Dermatologist providing tele dermatology services based on the transmission of medical images and/or patient data without a previous face to face, video or phone medical consultation the patient must be referred by another medical practitioner and your advice or opinion in respect to that patient must be provided to the referring practitioner.
